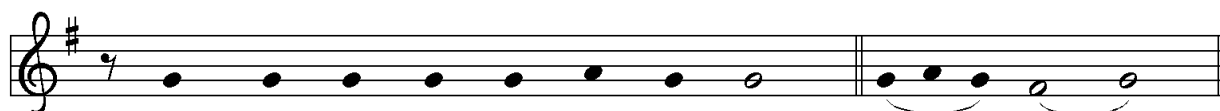

(Jeremiah 14:0)

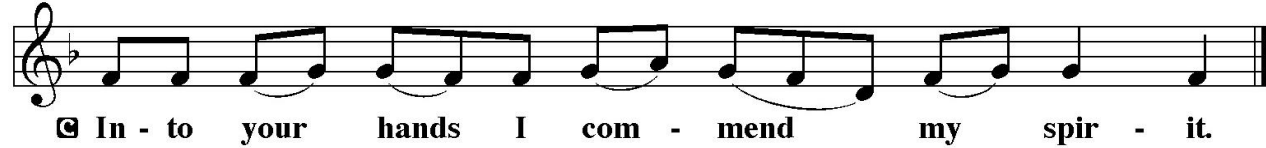
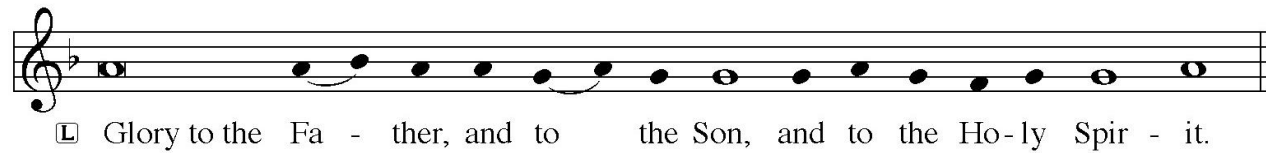
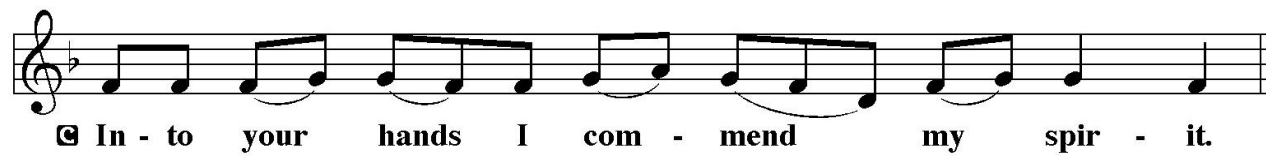
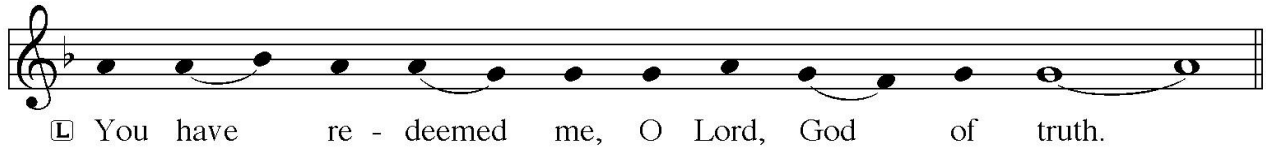
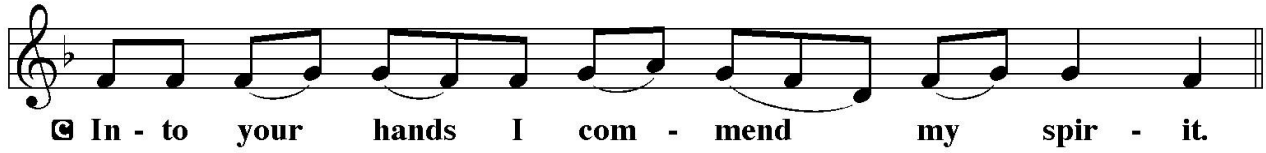
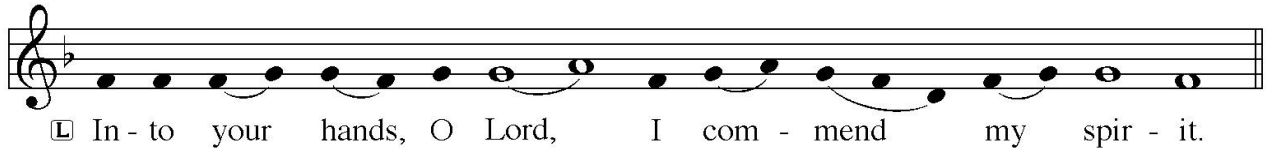

PRAYERS



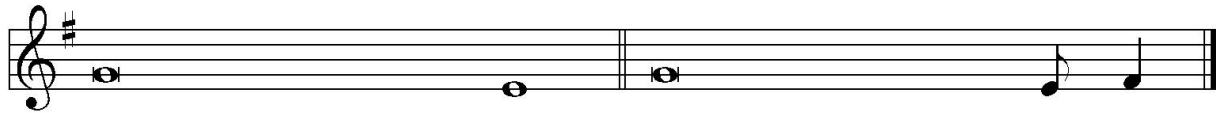
☐ Hear my prayer, O Lord;

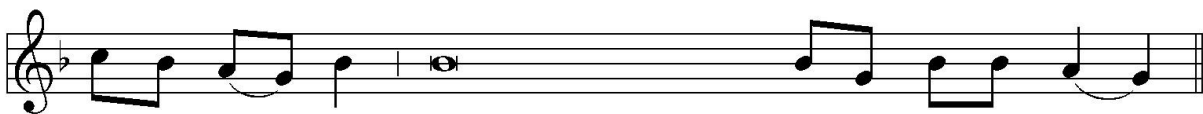




